The Biodiversity and Resilience of Ecosystems Duty Report 2026-2027

Introduction and Context:

Cardigan Town Council are committed to enhance biodiversity so far as is consistent with the proper exercise of their functions and in so doing promote the resilience of ecosystems. The council will follow the Nature Recovery Action Plan for Wales by following the six main objectives.

- Embed the consideration of biodiversity and ecosystems into our business and action planning, including any policies, plans, programmes, and projects as well as our day-to-day activities.
- Safeguard species and habitats of principal importance and improve their management.
- Increase the resilience of our natural environment by restoring degraded habitats and habitat creation.
- Tackle key pressures on species and habitats.
- Improve our evidence, understanding and monitoring.
- Put in place a framework of governance and support for delivery.

Cardigan Town Council serves the area of Cardigan and its population of around 3,300 residents. It has 14 councillors, covering the Mwldan (6 councillors), Rhyd-y-Fuwch (4 councillors) and Teifi (4 councillors) wards of Cardigan. The precept received by the council for 2026-27 is £108,927.

The Council's area comprises residential neighbourhoods, public open spaces, highway verges, community facilities, gardens, hedgerows, watercourses and agricultural land. These habitats support a range of wildlife including birds, pollinators, bats, small mammals and native plant species.
